- 4 201 KAR 39:090. Continuing education unit requirements.
- 5 RELATES TO: KRS 309.304(5)
- 6 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 309.304(3), 309.314(7)
- 7 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY:
- 8 KRS 309.314(7) authorizes the board to promulgate an administrative regulation that requires
- 9 interpreters who apply for renewal or reinstatement to show evidence of completion of continuing
- 10 education. This administrative regulation delineates the requirements for continuing education
- 11 <u>units</u> and prescribes methods and standards for the accreditation of continuing education courses.
- 12 Section 1. Accrual of Continuing Education Hours Mandatory for Full Licensure; Computation
- 13 of Accrual.
- 14 (1) A person who is licensed as an interpreter shall have earned a minimum of fifteen (15)
- 15 continuing education unit hours during each licensure period. total of fifteen (15) hours of
- 16 approved continuing education during the compliance period, prior to renewal of his or her license
- 17 for the next licensure period.]
- 18 (2) A minimum of half of the fifteen (15) hours shall be from any of the following sources,
- 19 alone or in combination:
- 20 (a) Alexander Graham Bell Association of the Deaf;
- 21 (b) American Sign Language Teacher Association;

1	(c) National Association of the Deaf;
2	(d) National Educational Interpreters Conference;
3	(e) Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf - Certificate Maintenance Program; or
4	(f) Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf - Associate Continuing Education Training.
5	(3) [A minimum of fifteen (15) continuing education hours shall be accrued by each licensee
6	during the licensure period for renewal for the following year.
7	(4)] A minimum of three (3) of the fifteen (15) [total] continuing education unit hours shall be
8	related to ethics. To be approved:
9	(a) The program title shall contain the word "ethics"; or,
10	(b) The licensee shall submit the course description for the board to review to determine
11	whether the program relates to the code of ethics for interpreters.
12	Section 2. Accrual of Continuing Education <u>Unit Hours Mandatory for Temporary Licensure</u> ;
13	Computation of Accrual.
14	(1) A person who holds a temporary license as an interpreter shall have earned a
15	minimum[total] of eighteen (18) hours of approved continuing education units during each the
16	compliance period, prior to [renewal or] extension of his or her license for the next] licensure
17	period.
18	(2) A minimum of seven and one-half (7.5) of the eighteen (18) hours shall be from any of the
19	following sources, alone or in combination;
20	(a) Alexander Graham Bell Association for the Deaf;
21	(b) American Sign Language Teacher Association;
22	(c) National Association of the Deaf;
23	(d) National Educational Interpreters Conference;

1	(e) Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf - Certificated Maintenance Program; or
2	(f) Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf - Associate Continuing Education Training.
3	(3) A minimum of three (3) of the eighteen (18) [total] continuing education unit hours shall
4	be related to ethics. To be approved:
5	(a) The program title shall contain the word "ethics"; or,
6	(b) The licensee shall submit the course description for the board to review to determine
7	whether the program relates to the code of ethics for interpreters.
8	Section 3. Methods of Acquiring Continuing Education <u>Unit Hours</u> . Continuing education <u>unit</u>
9	hours applicable to the renewal of the license shall be directly related to the professional growth
10	and development of an interpreter. The hours shall be earned by completing any of the following
11	educational activities:
12	(1) Programs not requiring board review and approval. An educational program from any of
13	the following providers shall be deemed to be relevant to the practice of interpreting and shall be
L 4	approved without further review by the board:
15	(a) A program sponsored or approved by the:
16	1. Alexander Graham Bell Association of the Deaf;
17	2. American Sign Language Teacher Association;
18	3. National Association of the Deaf; or
19	4. Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf; or
20	5. National Association of Interpreters in Education.
21	(b) An academic course offered by an accredited postsecondary institution that is directly
22	related to interpreting. Credit shall only be granted for grades of "C" or above.

(2) Programs requiring board review and approval. A program from any of the following sources shall be reviewed and determined if the program is relevant and therefore subsequently approved by the board:

- (a) Relevant programs, including <u>asynchronous and synchronous learning either in-person</u>
 <u>or virtual,[home study courses and in-service]</u> training provided by other organizations,
 educational institutions, or other service providers approved by the board;
- (b) Relevant programs or academic courses presented by the licensee. Presenters of relevant programs or academic courses may earn full continuing education credit for each contact hour of instruction, not to exceed three (3) hours of continuing education credits. Credit shall not be issued for repeated presentation of the same course.
- (c) Authoring an article in a relevant, professionally-recognized, or juried publication. Credit shall not be granted for an article unless the article was published within the one (1) year period immediately preceding the renewal date. A licensee shall earn three (3) hours of continuing education credit toward the hours required for renewal. No more than one (1) publication shall be counted during a renewal period.
- (d) A general education course, elective course, or a course designed to meet degree requirements offered by an accredited postsecondary institution. Academic credit equivalency for continuing education hours shall be based on one (1) credit hour equals 10 continuing education hours. Credit shall only be granted for grades of "C" or above.
- Section 4. Procedures for Preapproval of Continuing Education <u>Unit Sponsors and Programs</u>.
 - (1) Any entity seeking to obtain approval of a continuing education program prior to its offering shall complete and submit the Application for Continuing Education Program Approval

1 form to the board at least sixty (60) days in advance of the commencement of the program, stating 2 the following: 3 (a) A published course or similar description containing educational objectives; 4 (b) Names and qualifications of the instructors; 5 (c) A copy of the program agenda indicating hours of instruction, coffee and lunch breaks; 6 [and] 7 (d) Number of continuing education unit hours being requested[offered]; and 8 (e) A copy of the evaluation. 9 (2) A continuing education activity shall be approved [qualified for approval] if the board 10 determines the activity being offered: 11 (a) Is an organized program of learning; 12 (b) Pertains to subject matters, which integrally relate to the practice of interpreting; 13 (c) Contributes to the professional competency of the licensee; and 14 (d) Is conducted by individuals who have educational training or experience acceptable to 15 the board. 16 (3) A sponsor of continuing education requiring board approval shall be responsible for 17 submitting a course offering to the board for review and approval before listing or advertising that 18 offering as approved by the board. 19 Section 5. Responsibilities and Reporting Requirements of Licensees. A licensee shall be 20 responsible for obtaining the required continuing education unit hours. [He shall identify his own 21 continuing education needs, take the initiative in seeking continuing education activities to meet 22 these needs, and seek ways to integrate new knowledge, skills and attitudes. Each person holding 23 a license shall:

1 (1) Select approved activities by which to earn continuing education hours; 2 (2) Submit to the board when applicable a request for approval for continuing education 3 activities not approved by the board as set forth in Section 7 of this administrative regulation; 4 (1)[(3)] Maintain records of continuing education unit hours. Each licensee shall maintain all 5 documentation verifying successful completion of continuing education unit hours for a period of 6 two (2) years from the date of renewal. During each licensure renewal period, up to fifteen (15) 7 percent of all licensees, chosen at random, shall be required by the board to furnish documentation 8 of the completion of the appropriate number of continuing education unit hours for the current 9 renewal period. Verification of continuing education unit hours shall not be otherwise reported to 10 the board; 11 [(4)-Document attendance and participation in a continuing education activity in the form of 12 official documents including transcripts, certificates, affidavits signed by instructors, (receipts-for fees paid to the sponsor, or less formal evidence including written summaries of experience that 13 14 are not otherwise formally or officially documented in any way. The type of documentation 15 required shall vary depending on the specific activity submitted to the board for approval; and 16 (2) (5) Fully comply with the provisions of this administrative regulation. Failure to comply 17 shall constitute a violation of KRS 309.318(1)(c) and may result in the refusal to renew, 18 suspension, or revocation of the licensure.

Section 6. Procedures for Approval of Continuing Education Programs. A <u>program [eourse,]</u> which has not been preapproved by the board, may be used for continuing education <u>units</u> if <u>the licensee submits the program for board approval [is secured from the board for the course]</u>. In order for the board to adequately review a program <u>for approval</u>, the following information shall be submitted:

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1	(1) A published course or similar description containing educational objectives; and
2	(2) Names and qualifications of the instructors.
3	(3) A copy of the program agenda indicating hours of instruction, coffee and lunch breaks;
4	(4) Number of continuing education hours being requested; and
5	(5) A copy of the course evaluation.
6	Section 7. Carry Over of Continuing Education Unit Hours. A licensee with a full license may
7	carry over six (6) continuing education unit hours earned in excess of those required under Section
8	1 of this administrative regulation for one (1) renewal period, after which time they expire. Al
9	carry-over hours shall comply with the requirements of Sections 1 through 3 of this administrative
LO	regulation.
11	Section 8. Board to Approve Continuing Education Unit Hours; Appeal when Approva
12	Denied. In the event of a denial, in whole or in part, of any application for approval of continuing
13	education hours, the licensee shall have the right to request reconsideration by the board of its
L 4	decision. The request shall be in writing, specifically stating the reasons for reconsideration, and
15	shall be received by the board within thirty (30) days of the board's decision denying approval o
l6	continuing education hours.
17	Section 9. [Waiver or Extensions of Continuing Education. All requests for waiver or extension
18	shall accompany the License Renewal Application Form.
19	(1) Upon written request, the board shall consider whether to grant a waiver of continuing
20	education requirements or an extension of time within which to fulfill the requirements, in the
21	following cases:
22	(a) Medical disability of the licensee:

(b) Illness of the licensee or an immediate family member;

2	(d) For good cause shown.]
3	(2) A written request for a waiver or extension of time involving medical disability or illness
4	shall be:
5	(a) Submitted by the person holding a license; and
6	(b) Accompanied by a verifying document-signed by a licensed physician.
7	(3) A request for a waiver or extension of the continuing education requirements applies
8	only to the current licensure year.
9	(a) Subsequent requests for waiver or extension of the continuing education requirements
10	shall be made at the time of licensure renewal.
11	(b) There shall be no limit to the number of waivers or extensions that the board may
12	grant, as long as the applicant meets the requirements set forth in subsections (1) and (2)
13	of this section.
14	Section 10.] Continuing Education Requirements for Reinstatement of License.
15	(1) A person requesting reinstatement of licensure shall submit evidence of completion of
16	required hours of continuing education units within the twelve (12) month period immediately
17	preceding the date on which the request for reinstatement is submitted to the board.
18	(2) If the person seeking reinstatement does not meet the requirements established in
19	subsection (1) of this section, the board may conditionally reinstate licensure, requiring the
20	applicant to obtain required hours of continuing education units within six (6) months of the date
21	on which licensure is reinstated.
22	(3) The continuing education unit hours received in compliance with this section for
23	reinstatement shall be in addition to the regular continuing education <u>unit</u> requirements established

(c) Death or serious injury of an immediate family member; [or

- (a) What this administrative regulation does: : This regulation sets requirements for approval of continuing education courses and sets licensee requirements for acceptable continuing education.
- (b) The necessity of this administrative regulation: This regulation sets requirements for approval of continuing education courses and sets licensee requirements for acceptable continuing education.
- (c) How this administrative regulation conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: The regulation is in conformity as the authorizing statute gives the board the ability to promulgate regulations generally.
- (d) How this administrative regulation currently assists or will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: This regulation sets requirements for approval of continuing education courses and sets licensee requirements for acceptable continuing education.

 - (a) How the amendment will change this existing administrative regulation: This amendment clarifies existing procedures and requirements and adds the word "unit" throughout to clarify the standard for this profession which may differ from the continuing education calculation for various certifying organizations or agencies.
 - (b) The necessity of the amendment to this administrative regulation: This amendment clarifies existing procedures and requirements.
 - (c) How the amendment conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: The regulation is in conformity as the authorizing statute gives the board the ability to promulgate regulations generally related to the practice of interpreting.
 - (d) How the amendment will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: This amendment will incorporate the current application for licensure form. This amendment will allow the board to determine certifications that have expired and licensees that may not have up to date skills.
- (3) List the type and number of individuals, businesses, organizations, or state and local governments affected by this administrative regulation: There are 533 full and 45 temporarily licensed interpreters.

- IV. Summary of Comments and Responses.
 - 1. Subject Matter: Continuing Education Units (CEUs) for Ethics and Request to Use Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) Standards and Timeframes for Ethics Requirements and CEU in Kentucky.
 - (a) Comment: One comment was received as follows: In the early/mid 2000's, I worked to get licensure in Kentucky because of so many abuses... It was intended that RID CEU's satisfy the KBI requirements. I lived out of state for 15 years. I see a conflict and extra burden on RID nationally certified interpreters because the CEU cycles for KY and RID do not align. For example, all my RID CEUs are complete, but it did not satisfy KY requirements. PPO is an ethical issue, but because the word "Ethics" was not in the title, my CEU's in this area were not accepted (while others were, or they didn't get audited). I had to scramble last minute to find 3 hours of workshops that included the word Ethics in the title. RID requires 80 hours in a 3 year cycle, which is over and above the KBI requirement. However, if an interpreter completes those hours in the first 2 years of their cycle, KBI will require an additional 15 hours the 3rd year, extra expense and time for overworked interpreters. How can we align RID CEU's with KBI as originally intended? Can we go to a 3 year cycle that matches that of our interpreters to accept the met RID requirements?

(b) Response: The Board acknowledges this comment and states that Power, Privilege and Oppression ("PPO") is a separate and independent program which does not fulfill the regulatory obligation for annual CEUs in ethics in Kentucky, and further states that Kentucky's annual CEU requirement cannot be aligned with RID's 3-year CEU cycle but offers that CEUs obtained for Kentucky can be used to help fulfill the RID CEU requirements. However, the Board concurs the ethics requirement should be clarified based on these comments and therefore the regulation will be amended after these comments to specify the program title must include the word "ethics" or the licensee may submit a course description that clearly delineates the program relates to the code of ethics for interpreters.

Statement of Consideration and Action Taken by Promulgating Administrative Body

The public hearing on this administrative regulation was canceled; however, one (1) written comment was received. The Kentucky Board of Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing is amending this administrative regulation in response to public comment received to clarify that Kentucky's continuing education unit requirement for ethics relates specifically to the code of ethics for interpreters.
